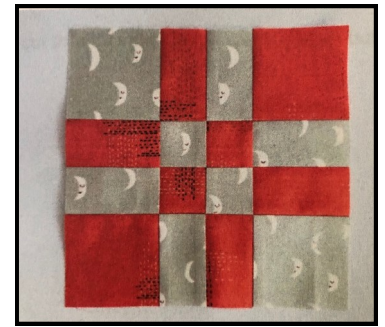
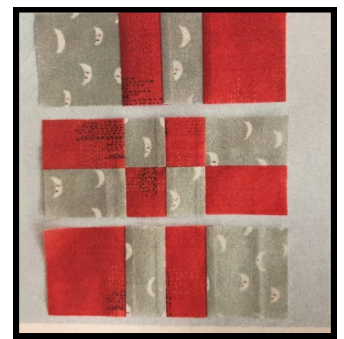
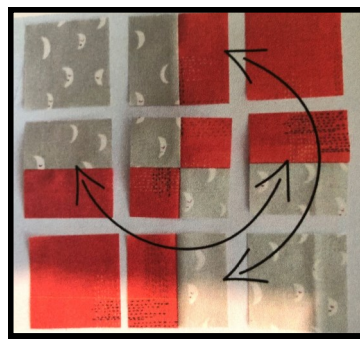
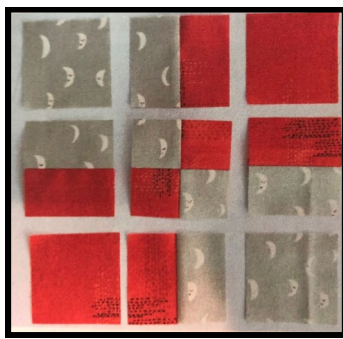
Block of the Month**MARCH****Cheryl Griffin and Barbara Laycock****DISAPPEARING 4 PATCH****You will need:**

Colour A (2) - 4 ½" by 4 ½" squares (white)

Colour B (2) - 4 ½" by 4 ½" squares (colour of choice)

Directions:

1. Sew all the squares together into a four patch block with alternating fabrics.
2. Cut across the whole block 1 ½" from either side of both seams.
3. Swap the two central vertical-seam rectangle pieces, then swap the two horizontal-seam rectangle pieces.
4. Sew the pieces together into 3 rows.
5. Sew the three rows together.

Knots and Patches

As quilters we're often asked to complete quilts, make memory quilts, and turn treasured items into quilts. I was once asked to compete a half finished quilt from 1975 that had been partially assembled using the 'quilt-as-you-go' method. The material was the calicoes, popular at that time in primary colours. It took some doing to reconfigure the blocks and sew it together before quilting.

Recently a message came from a woman wanting to turn the souvenir pillows she had collected on her travels over the years into a quilt. **Susan Atherton** and I went to see her collection before we committed to the project. And what a collection of pillows it was - all shapes, all sizes and such a great variety of material.

Vivienne is a 90 year old spitfire who lives on 20 acres out in the country. She moved to Ontario from Winnipeg in the 1950's. She was a teacher at Central Public, Tecumseh, Wellington Square and a few others she has forgotten. She taught math and science and later moved over to Special Ed. Wouldn't it truly be a small world if any of our members had Vivienne as a teacher?

Vivienne loves to travel and has hiked and biked all over the world, "slowing down a bit" in recent times. She loves new experiences, new places, new adventures, and meeting new people. While on her travels, Vivienne would collect souvenirs in the form of pillows – her house is chock-a-block full of these. Susan and I decided to accept the challenge! But we did ask Vivienne to take all the forms out of the cases! The cases later came home with us and voila - a "cushion" quilt!

Vivienne has bred Golden Retrievers since the 1950's and then switched to Bernese Mountain Dogs (just for the record, Bill and I have had four!). Although not actively breeding dogs at this time, her website **Falcon Lake Kennels** has some gorgeous pictures of her dogs. Vivienne currently has five dogs, and Susan and I hope to spend some time with the pups when we deliver the quilt this month. Having a sense of humour, Vivienne says how many we get to play with depends on the quilt – whether it is a 1 dog quilt, a 2 dog quilt, and so on. I am pretty confident that we have a 5-dog quilt!
