- 30 hearts and 5 blankets to Joseph Brant Hospital


Kits for the hearts and blankets will not be available at the March meeting, but you may still bring in your donations as arrangements have been made to collect them.

MARCH

DISAPPEARING 4 PATCH

You will need:


Colour A (2) - 4 1/2" by 4 1/2" squares (white)


Colour B (2) - 4 ½" by 4 ½" squares (colour of choice)

Directions:

- 1. Sew all the squares together into a four patch block with alternating fabrics.
- 2. Cut across the whole block 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " from either side of both seams.
- 3. Swap the two central vertical-seam rectangle pieces, them swap the two horizontal-seam rectangle pieces.
- 4. Sew the pieces together into 3 rows.
- 5. Sew the three rows together.





Knots and Patches

As quilters we're often asked to complete quilts, make memory quilts, and turn treasured items into quilts. I was once asked to compete a half finished quilt from 1975 that had been partially assembled using the 'quilt-as-you-go' method. The material was the calicoes, popular at that time in primary colours. It took some doing to reconfigure the blocks and sew it together before quilting.

Recently a message came from a woman wanting to turn the souvenir pillows she had collected on her travels over the years into a quilt. **Susan Atherton** and I went to see her collection before we committed to the project. And what a collection of pillows it was - all shapes, all sizes and such a great variety of material.

Vivienne is a 90 year old spitfire who lives on 20 acres out in the country. She moved to Ontario from Winnipeg in the 1950's. She was a teacher at Central Public, Tecumseh, Wellington Square and a few others she has forgotten. She taught math and science and later moved over to Special Ed. Wouldn't it

truly be a small world if any of our members had Vivienne as a teacher?

Vivienne loves to travel and has hiked and biked all over the world, "slowing down a bit" in recent times. She loves new experiences, new places, new adventures, and meeting new people. I very much enjoy piecing a quilt made of different blocks and not repetitive piecing. Right now I am working on the 365 day quilt challenge and hope to be done by the end of the year. I am thoroughly enjoying creating the 3.5" blocks using a multitude of quilt blocks and techniques. I would highly recommend the **Kathryn Kerr 365 Day Challenge**.

Will you share with us "I can't believe I did that quilting moment?"

Hmm. Which one to choose? LOL I would say the most unforgettable one is quilting an entire row on my longarm only to find out I loaded my backing with wrong side out. (Thanks for sharing that!)

Anything else you would like us to know about you and your business?




