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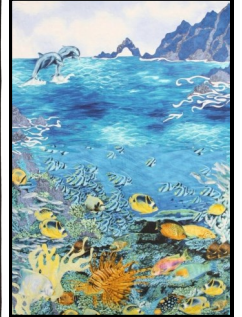

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Block of the Month

FEBRUARY

BASKET IV (10" square)

Block of the Month

You will need:

Colour 1: square A, B,F,H

Colour 2: square C, D

Colour 3: square E, O

1 of Square A - 3" by 3" square

1 of Square E - 5 7/8" by 5 7/8" square

1 of Square B - 6 1/4" by 6 1/4" square

2 of Square F - 3" x 5 1/2" rectangles

2 of Square C - 3 3/8" by 3 3/8" square

1 of Square G - 3 3/8" x 3 3/8" square

1 of Square D - 5 7/8" by 5 7/8" square

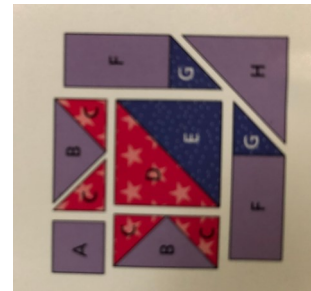
1 of Square H - 5 7/8" x 5 7/8" square

- Sub Cut Instructions:**
1. Cut Square B into 4 triangles.
 2. Cut Square C into 2 triangles.
 3. Cut Square D into 2 triangles.
 4. Cut Square E into 2 triangles.
 5. Cut Square G into 2 triangles.
 6. Cut Square H into 2 triangles.



Block Assembly:

1. Sew a Square C triangle to either side of a Square B triangle.
2. Sew a Square A to the right side of the CBC strip. This is Row 1.
3. Assemble another CBC strip (repeat step 1).
4. Sew a Square D triangle to a Square E triangle.
5. Sew the 2nd CBC strip to the DE square. This is Row 2.
6. Sew Rows 1 and 2 together.

Halton Quilters Guild President's Challenge 2025

This year's challenge involves a little prep before you begin to work on the quilt. Plan to pick up a sudoku puzzle and instruction sheet at a meeting. The puzzle involves filling the cells with the numbers 1-9. There are nine 3 X 3 cells. You fill in the numbers so that each number is used ONLY ONCE in each separate line, column, and 3X3 square.

You will create nine 9 patch squares according to the puzzle. There are only straight seams in this quilt, no curves or HSTs! The finished flimsy will measure ~ 48" x 48" before the final border (optional).

For the quilt you will need:

- 9 different fabrics cut into 9 X 4.5" squares. You should be able to get nine squares from a 4.5" WOF strip. Label each of the 9 fabric piles with the numbers 1-9. It is a good idea to also label a scrap of each fabric with the same numbers 1-9.
- A solid or tone on tone for sashing that will be cut into 3" strips (or your choice for width). For the sashing, 0.75-1 yard should be more than enough.
- Fabric for a border is optional. This can be one of the fabrics used in the puzzle or another one of your choice.

Keep the puzzle by your side as you construct each 9-patch and when you assemble the flimsy.

1. Layout your first block according to the first 3X3 cell in the puzzle.
2. Make one block at a time and label it (Block #1, etc.).
3. Your label should be in the same position for each block (e.g. right hand upper corner) so that the orientation of the block remains true to the puzzle.
4. Continue until you have made all 9 blocks.
5. Layout the blocks in order and run a final check that they are in the correct spot.
6. Add 3" sashing in your preferred manner.

The flimsy must be assembled in order so that the requirements of the puzzle are met – ONLY ONE number in each 9-patch, line, or column. You may wish to add an additional border – width of your choice. Quilt as desired.

Final check on rules for Sudoku:

Use numbers 1-9.

Do not repeat any numbers in cells, rows, or columns.

Do not guess. Use the process of elimination.

I hope you enjoy this challenge. While 9-patch quilts are great, and usually one of the first we teach beginner quilters, the addition of the Sudoku challenge gives it an additional twist.

Please bring your finished Sudoku quilts to the first meeting in September 2025 for a parade of quilts. Happy quilting!

Knots and Patches

There is certainly a lot going on in our guild as we move into the second half of the quilting year ... our monthly meeting, Block of the Month, the Quilt Show Challenge, Halton Hearts and Neonatal Blankets, Comfort Quilt Programme, Sew Days and Workshops, and the President's Challenge! Can you believe how fast January flew by and now February has marched in as if it owned the place? Guess when you're the shortest month you have to make a statement.

This year's **President's Challenge** is to solve a Sudoku puzzle and then create a quilt with 9 different fabrics to make nine blocks following the puzzle to assemble the quilt. This will give you a 9 X 9 quilt – add sashing, some borders, and cornerstones and you have a masterpiece of puzzling genius!!

Thank you to **Sue Curran** for sharing her planning process:



Choose the nine fabrics you want to have in this quilt. Some of you may decide to tackle a more complicated version and make 9 different pieced or appliqued blocks. (I can't wait to see those).



You will likely have a thin strip left from cutting the 4.5" squares. A good idea is to make a fabric swatch with each one numbered so that you can remember where each fabric will be placed in the block.



Finally, solve the puzzle and create 'block cards' that can be pinned on each block so that you can remember the placement of that block in the puzzle!

It is really important that you keep the puzzle, fabric swatch and 'block cards' beside you as you sew and refer to them while constructing the block.

"Sudoku is like life. It may seem complicated at first, but with persistence and practice, you can master it." - ANONYMOUS

I found this quilted journal cover tutorial while running through some YouTube videos in the very early hours. **Shelley Robson** from the **Quilted Forest** (<https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=717-AIZrN9A>) gave very clear instructions and measurements. She quilted hers on a domestic with top and batting, but when you have a longarm, you might as well use it! I made a couple and prepped a few more. The **Northcott Colour Collage** fabric is perfect for this project. Hmmm. Maybe a future workshop?

“Stitches in Our Time”

WOW!! Look at the stunning fabric from **Northcott** for our Quilt Show challenge. This line is so colourful and fun. I will definitely be looking for it in the stores.

a new line “Boho Blooms” by Deborah Edwards (Navy Leaves).

Fabric packages will be available at the monthly meetings. You will receive a packet of three fat quarters - one each of the fabrics pictured above. There is a **\$5.00 fee** to participate in the challenge.

The theme of the challenge is “Seasons” and the rules are as follows:

- ◆ The theme is yours to interpret - be creative.
- ◆ The quilt **MUST** use some of each of the fabric in such a way that it is visible - how much or how little is up to you.
- ◆ You may include any other fabrics.
- ◆ The quilt may use any techniques and be embellished in any way.
- ◆ The perimeter of the quilt is not to exceed 80 inches (~200cm).
- ◆ There must be three layers - flimsy, some kind of batting, and a backing.
- ◆ The quilt can be any shape but must be finished with binding, facing or a pillow-style finish. There should be some way to hang the quilt (your choice of hanging sleeve).
- ◆ Odd shaped or multi panelled items should be mounted on black fabric with a sleeve.
- ◆ Please include a label with the title of the quilt and your name. This can be pinned on if you do not want to sew it to the quilt but it must be well fastened to withstand some handling.
- ◆ Please include a short note on your interpretation of 'Seasons'.

The finished quilt should be handed in at the May 1st meeting or no later than May 18th to **Sue Curran** or **Katherine Hunter**. If you are not handing in at the May meeting, please contact Sue or Katherine to make arrangements to deliver the quilt.

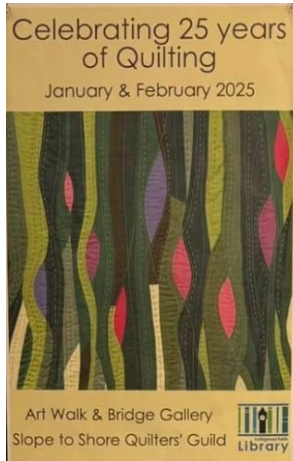

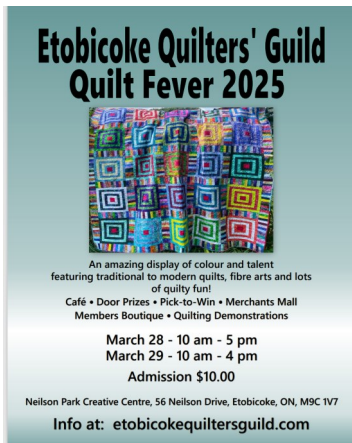
