

We look forward to another fun Christmas meeting with delicious snacks and some social time!







I was fortunate to travel to New Brunswick to visit my daughter, Tory, and while there we had the opportunity to attend classes with Australian quilter Gloria Loughman. Both classes dealt a lot with learning about colour and design. Her new book <u>Fabulous Facades</u> delves into how to create quilts with fused fabric and looks at everything from design and colour to fabric, pattern design, construction and finishing. The inspiration for the quilts that you will create come from the buildings and architecture all around us. Wonky houses, skyscrapers, doors, fences, old or new, colourful or maybe colourless. This book will guide you through the process to create a beautiful memory of a favourite place with comprehensive attention to fabric, colour and the elements of design. Her methods are accessible to both the new or seasoned quilter.

She was a fascinating person to meet and work with. Watch for this new book in our library soon!


CONGRATULATIONS TO JIM WILFORD!
