

 DOUBLE 80"x 90"
 QUEEN. 85"x 95"

ROTARY CUTTING TIPS (adapted from Thimbles and Things April 19 2024)

Speed and accuracy are the benefits of using a rotary cutter opposed to scissors. The rotary cutter was invented in the 1970's and allows you to cut through more than one fabric at a time which means more sewing time!

- The number one ruler of choice are the Creative Grids rulers, as they have built in anti-slip grips. These grips allow help prevent your ruler from moving when cutting
- If you do not have a Creative Grid ruler, don't fret. There are many products out there that you
 can adhere to your ruler to prevent it from slipping. From sprays to stickers, there is something
 for everyone.
- One type of anti-slip grips are the Gypsy Quilter No Slip Grip Dots & Hearts. Once they are applied, your ruler is not slipping anywhere. Surgical tape pieces can be applied to the underside too.
- When cutting your fabric, try the 'Walking Method'. I use this method on rulers that do not have any grips on them. Cut your fabric half way and then stop and walk your fingers up the ruler and then complete your cut. This will prevent your ruler from sliding at the top of your cut
- Use a 'weight' on the end of a long ruler to hold it form slipping. Something like a can or hand weight work fine.



Spotlight on Sharon Hayes....by Ellen Crymble



When Sharon Hayes' son went off to University she decided it was time to find something she would like to get involved in that was suitable for "just her". In 1999 she went as a guest to a meeting of the Bluewater Quilters' Guild. She later attended an Open House the Guild offered and in September of 1999 she joined as a new member. After a few years she decided to become involved in the Executive and soon assumed the roles of Library Co-ordinator, Treasurer, Quilt Show Vice Chairperson, Quilt Show Chair person, Vice President, President, Past President. Now as the Co-Chair of the Membership Committee she is one of the two people who greet you at our in person meetings. She asks you to sign the membership list and hopes you are wearing your name tag so you can be entered into the draw for something wonderful.

Sharon actually started a quilt prior to joining the Guild. She went to Mary Maxim in Paris Ontario and bought a kit for a wall hanging. Mary Maxim she knows from experience is a great place to shop and it's hard not to leave a lot of \$\$\$ there.

Three people have influenced and helped Sharon in her quilting journey. Sharon's Grandma Smith quilted at the church. She was always making quilts and Sharon was the lucky recipient of one of those quilts. She examined each block, studying it carefully and felt the comfort one receives when sleeping under a quilt made with loving hands. Grandma Smith became her inspiration.

One day fellow member Ruth Gole accompanied Sharon to a quilt store in Thornbury called Serendipity and owned by Marg Nattress. Marg offered to help Sharon by giving her free lessons. She and Ruth would often go over in the evenings after work and Marg would help and offer advice on accurate piecing. Sharon selected the Pansy Park Quilt pattern as her first quilt. I was amazed at how complex this pattern looked but to this day and with Marg's help and Ruth's assistance it turned out to be the most accurately pieced quilt she has ever made. It is still on her bed today. Sharon had it expertly quilted by Mary Gunson.

Sharon's third mentor is Fran Caple, another Guild member and from Fran Sharon was introduced to modern quilting. Fran's incredible sense of colour, creativity and willingness to try something new inspired Sharon to delve right in. Fran's positive attitude to things especially new patterns etc. guided Sharon into the world of modern quilting.



The most recent Dresden Plate class is something she wants to try as well. The Quilt as you Go Class is on her bucket list. Sharon is drawn in by certain patterns and likes quilts that are in bright colours. She has 4 grandsons and each one has one of her quilts on their bed. Sharon doesn't have a "favourite" quilt block or pattern as there are so many new ones to try. She does consider herself a modern quilter now.

Her advice to new quilters is to take as many classes as possible because you will learn something in each one even if you don't actually finish your project. Take advantage of senior members who have a wealth of knowledge and are willing to share their skills with you. Mary Gunson and Janet Price were two people in our Guild who showed Sharon a lot of things. Thanks Sharon for your strong involvement in our Guild.
